

Hello all! Terri here.

Several people have been asking how I am feeling after the surgery, etc. so I thought I would send you a little update. The surgery was Thursday, January 28th, 3 p.m. or so our time (so most of you would have been sleeping at 2 a.m. Thursday morning your time). The surgery was pretty rough for several reasons, most of which I won't go into, but mostly because toward the end, perhaps after one too many freezing needles for my body to handle, my blood pressure dropped, making me feel pretty terrible. They quickly started to monitor my heart, BP, etc. They said my BP went down to 94/60 and my heart rate had slowed down as well.

Even though I felt really quite terrible, I genuinely knew Jesus was right beside me. I pictured him right beside me with his hand on my head. Thank you so much for your prayers. The Dr. and nurses were great; they immediately put me on oxygen and then kept me in observation / recovery for about an hour until I felt strong enough to come back home. I had to go back in the next day (yesterday) for them to give me a quick check-up and I will have to return again on Monday for the same thing. They are really being cautious that I don't get infection, and I am really grateful for their caution and care. Please, if the Lord brings me to your mind, continue to pray for me, this time, that the Lord would help my body ward off any infection.

As always, God is good and He has been with me. Even though it was what they would call a "minor" operation, it sure didn't feel minor to me, so I am so, *so* thankful to all of you who prayed for me. I know there were several people whom God woke up around the time I was going in, and they prayed for me. I know many of you prayed when you received the email because you are like me, and you knew if you didn't pray right then and there, life's busyness might overtake you, and you might forget. No matter when or how, thank you for your prayers. I feel incredibly blessed to have so much support.
